

ARTICLE I – SELECTION

1. The Selection Committee shall be composed of: the Chair, a DOSO representative (Director of Greek Programs or designee), a non-returning Greek Judicial Board member, an IFC representative, and a Panhellenic representative.
2. This Committee shall select a new Chair by October 15, unless the current chair is in good standing and stays on for another term. Once selected and confirmed by the Senate, the Chair-elect shall become a regular member of the Committee
3. The selection and approval of all new members of the Greek Judicial Board shall be completed by November 5.
4. It shall require a two-thirds vote of the Selection Committee to place a member on the Greek Judicial Board and to select a Chair.
5. The Selection Committee shall name eight Greek Judicial Board members and five alternates (including returning members in good standing who are not required to reapply).
6. Only one member may be from any given house. An alternate can be from the same house as a regular member. There may be a regular member from the same house as the Chair.
7. Applicants must have at least a cumulative 2.50 GPA and in good judicial standing to be considered for any position on the Board.
8. The new Chair shall name a Vice-Chair from among the members of the Board.
9. The new Chair shall name such other officers from among the members of the Board as is deemed necessary.
10. The new members of the Greek Judicial Board shall take over responsibilities of the Greek Judicial Board on January 1. All new members shall attend a training session which shall be coordinated by the Chair and the Office of the Dean of Students and be completed by December 15.
11. Should the position of Chair become vacant during the term, the Vice Chair shall assume the position and appoint another member to serve as Vice Chair. Should a member position become vacant, an alternate shall be chosen by the Chair to serve as member. All candidates must meet the requirements and conditions for said positions.
12. All former members of the Greek Judicial Board who have served a minimum of six months shall be an alternate to the Greek Judicial Board, provided they are registered students in good academic and judicial standing.
13. All applicants must be initiated members of a Greek chapter recognized by the Dean of Student's Office and the Interfraternity Council or the Panhellenic Association. Additionally, all applicants must be considered active members of their chapter. An applicant's chapter must be recognized by the Institute (i.e., not suspended or expelled) and must not have pending judicial action to sit on the Board.

ARTICLE II – RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERS

1. The Chair of the Greek Judicial Board shall have overall responsibility for facilitating Greek Judicial Board hearings and shall preside over board meetings.

2. In the Chair's absence, the Vice-Chair shall assume the duties of the Chair.
3. Other members shall be responsible for work assigned to them by the Chair.
4. Attendance at all meetings and hearings shall be mandatory. Any member with two unexcused absences from meetings or any unexcused absence from hearings shall be recommended for removal. The Chair and the Senior Judicial Administrator shall determine the requirements for excused absences.
5. Members of the Board must maintain at least a cumulative 2.50 GPA. If a member's cumulative GPA falls below 2.50, they will be excused from the Board until such time that his or her cumulative GPA meets the requirement.
6. Board members must adhere to all provisions of the judicial system. Any member charged with a violation of the Grounds for Disciplinary Action (or with a criminal offense) will be suspended from their board position during the resolution of the charges and removed permanently if found in violation.

ARTICLE III – JURISDICTION OF THE GREEK JUDICIAL BOARD

1. It shall be the duty of the Greek Judicial Board to examine and decide appropriate action in case, of alleged misconduct by a recognized fraternity or sorority, referred to it by the Office of the Dean of Students.
2. It shall be the duty of the Greek Judicial Board to hear appeals of IFC and Panhellenic decisions that are deemed to violate the IFC or Panhellenic Constitution or Relationship Statement.

ARTICLE IV – PROCEDURES

1. The Greek Judicial Board shall follow the Institute Hearing Procedures for hearing disciplinary and civil cases.
2. All decisions shall be made by a majority vote.
3. After the Greek Judicial Board has reached a conclusion, if either party to the case feels new evidence would alter the decision of the Board, they may appeal in writing to the Chair via the Judicial Administrator in the Dean of Students Office within the specified time period.
4. In the absence of both the Chair and Vice-Chair, the Chair shall name a Greek Judicial Board member to chair the meeting or hearing.
5. Quorum shall be five members, at least three of whom must be regular members.
6. Any Chair or member whose house is involved in an alleged judicial violation is prohibited from hearing the case and, in the interest of integrity, will be suspended from his/her board position until the resolution of said case if the action does not result in the chapter's suspension or expulsion.
7. Only one member from any one house may serve on the hearing.
8. In all initial disciplinary cases, the Hearing Officer shall bear the burden of proof. In appeal cases and civil cases, the plaintiff or the person filing the appeal shall bear the burden of proof.

ARTICLE V – AMENDMENTS

Amendments to these by-laws must be consistent with Institute policy and protocol and shall require two-thirds approval of the Greek Judicial Board, followed by a majority approval of the IFC and PC.
